

Level 3 Immediate Management of Anaphylaxis

An Anaphylactic shock, or anaphylaxis, is a life-threatening, serious allergic reaction to an allergen such as food substances or insect stings. If it is not treated appropriately, it can be life-threatening.

This training is for qualified First Aiders and Emergency First Aiders to enable them to recognise and treat anaphylaxis safely and effectively.

This 6-hour course enables delegates to: -

- Describe anaphylaxis
- Identify triggers for anaphylaxis
- Describe life threatening problems associated with anaphylaxis
- Conduct an initial assessment using the ABCDE approach (primary survey)
- Demonstrate the recovery position
- Perform effective CPR
- Use a defibrillator
- Explain the treatment for anaphylaxis
- Identify key features of adrenaline-auto injectors
- Prepare medication for administration during anaphylaxis treatment
- Demonstrate the safe use of an adrenaline auto-injector

Our courses are very "hands-on" as we believe practicing the techniques is a far more effective way of learning. Practical demonstrations and exercises supported by on-screen presentations and lots of verbal interaction is our way of training.

This qualification lasts for 3 years. However, it is recommended that during the 3-year period, the learners attend annual refresher courses.
